- 1997 Act 27 and 1999 Act 9
- Outreach Advisory Committee
 - Supported by technical committees
 - Met over 18 months
- First rule version 22 public hearings in March 2000
- Second rule version 12 public hearings in March 2001

Agricultural Performance Standards - NR 151

- Sheet, rill and wind erosion
- Manure storage facilities
- Clean water diversions
- Nutrient management
- Manure management prohibitions
 - No overflow of manure structures
 - No unconfined manure stacks in WQMAs
 - No direct runoff from feedlots
 - No unlimited livestock access

Agricultural Revisions NR 151

- "T" measured by RUSLE II
- Remove riparian buffer and grassed waterway performance standards
 - buffers as written will be largely ineffective and are prohibitively expensive
 - buffers will largely be implemented through CREP
 - removes navigability concerns
 - replace with effective BMPs that are voluntary but with incentives
 - give preference in TRM for projects including these measures

Nutrient Management

■ NR 151.07(3)(b)1. - ...the plan shall be designed to maintain or reduce soil nutrient concentrations so as to manage delivery of nutrients contributing to the impairment of impaired surface waters and to outstanding and exceptional resource waters

Increases allowed if:

- Necessary to meet crop demands
- Background water quality will not be altered (ORW and ERW only)
- Low delivery risk can be demonstrated (303(d))

Nutrient Management

- Nutrient management primarily Nbased, but may be P-based in limited target areas
 - Waters impaired by nutrients primarily P
 - 303 (d) list -
 - About 120 out of 560
 - Outstanding Resource Waters
 - Exceptional Resource Waters

Other Revisions - NR 151

- Implementation
 - DNR requirements
 - Rely on governmental units
 - Develop strategy / guidance

Non-Agricultural Revisions NR 151

- Revised infiltration standard for residential and commercial sites - 1% and 2% caps
- Removed 10,000 ft² threshold near navigable waters
- Modified runoff curve numbers
- Transportation
 - Construction site erosion control matrix
 - Exempted highways from infiltration

Revisions to NR 154

- Greater flexibility in economic hardship determinations
- Agricultural technical standards are referenced to ATCP 50
- Grassed waterway and riparian buffer incentives

- Package to the Natural Resources Board
 - late November, 2001 January 2002
- Presentation to the Land and Water Conservation Board - December 3/4, 2001
- Available to the public at our website in early January, 2002

Performance Standard Rule Status

- Presentation to the Natural Resources Board at the January 22 / 23, 2002 meeting
- If approved, forwarded to the legislature for its review and comment
- Final rules effective in late spring to summer, 2002
- Practical effect 2003 season
